- Have visual representations at all venues
- Embrace the challenge of creating an abuse-free environment
- Increase visibility of game night staff

COMMUNITY CLUBS

- Communicate the Zero-Tolerance Policy to club members
- Encourage respect for officials
- Be accountable for member behaviour
- Educate members on the Rules of Basketball

COACHES & PLAYERS

- Be aware of the Zero-Tolerance Policy
- Set a positive example by their actions
- Focus on their own roles

SPECTATORS

- Be aware of the Zero-Tolerance Policy
- Remember tis is community sport
- Support and encourage effort and enjoyment
- Hold everyone to a high behavioural standard

If abuse towards an official occurs and continues within a game:

- 1: The game will be stopped by the referee or a staff member
- 2: A team or individual foul will be called. This can be called on spectators as well as coaches and players
3. If the behaviour continues, a technical foul will be applied
4. Further abuse will result in a disqualifying foul and ejection from the stadium
