



CLUB TRANSFERS, CLEARANCES AND LOANS

Am I allowed to change clubs?

Yes. All players are allowed to move to a club they choose. For some individuals there are penalties and restrictions for doing so, this may include what club you move too.

How do I change clubs?

To change clubs, you will need to speak to the club you are leaving and the club you are wanting to join before doing anything. To officially transfer to another club, all you need to do is start registering to your new club and PlayHQ will take care of the rest. An official from the club your leaving, your new club and GUB must approve the move, before you make any permanent changes. It will automatically be done after 14 days.

What is the difference between a loan and a clearance?

A loan is a temporary change of club for one season. This means that a club is essentially 'borrowing' you for a season. When the season is completed, you will be considered a player for your original club again.

A clearance is a permanent change of clubs. This means that you are moving over to your new club for good.

What are the penalties for changing a club?

For players who participated in the last two seasons of the Victorian Junior Basketball League (VJBL) you may carry some points. Each club is only allowed a certain amount of points at one time for each year of birth. If you have played VJBL, please make sure that you let your new club know this before your start to transfer.

Is a club allowed to refuse a transfer?

Yes. A club can refuse any form of transfer (Loan or clearance) if a player owes them funds or needs to return property (uniform). A club cannot refuse a transfer simply because they do not want the player to leave.

Can GUB deny a player from transferring?

Yes. GUB can deny players from moving clubs based on a number of different reasons. This is most likely to occur as a club doesn't have enough points left to fit a player in, or the transfer would breach a junior or Senior PPV rule. You can see the full rules in our By-Laws.

Who should I talk to have some questions about transferring answered?
